ORDINANCE NO. 724

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE DISPOSAL OF SURPLUS VILLAGE PROPERTY

WHEREAS, the Village of Greenup, Illinois is a duly organized and existing municipal corporation organized and operating under the constitution and laws of the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the Village derives its rights, power and authority from the various sections of the Municipal Code and the Village Code; and

WHEREAS, the Village has determined according to law that there exists certain personal property owned by the Village listed in Exhibit A attached hereto, which is no longer necessary or useful to, or for the best interests of, the Village and is hereby declared to be surplus property;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE VILLAGE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF GREENUP, CUMBERLAND COUNTY, ILLINOIS, THAT:

SECTION ONE: The recitals set forth hereinabove are hereby incorporated as findings as if said recitals were fully set forth within this Section One.

SECTION TWO: That pursuant to Section 11-76-4 of the Illinois Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 5/11-76-4 (the "Code"), the Mayor and Board of Trustees find the property listed in Exhibit A to be no longer necessary or useful to, or for the best interests of, the Village and is hereby declared surplus property.

SECTION THREE: Pursuant to 65 ILCS 5/11-76-4, the Mayor and Board of Trustees hereby authorize and direct the Village Clerk, or her designee, to dispose of said surplus property in any manner she sees fit, which may include sale, auction, donation, or any other lawful means, at any time following the adoption of this Ordinance, and to take such other actions as the Village Clerk, or her designee, shall deem necessary or appropriate in order to carry out the intent and effect the provisions and purposes of this Ordinance.

SECTION FOUR: All Ordinances and Resolutions, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith, are hereby repealed.

SECTION FIVE: If any part or parts of this Ordinance shall be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity of the remaining parts of this Ordinance. The Village Board declares hereby that they would have passed the remaining parts of this Ordinance if they had known that such part or parts thereof would be declared unconstitutional.

SECTION SIX: The Village Clerk of the Village of Greenup is directed hereby to publish this Ordinance in pamphlet form.

SECTION SEVEN: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval in accordance with the manner prescribed by law.
