**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 5.04 OF THE VILLAGE CODE
WITH RESPECT TO LIQUOR LICENSE AND CONTROL**

WHEREAS, the Village of Greenup, Illinois is a duly organized and existing municipal corporation organized and operating under the constitution and laws of the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the Village derives its rights, power and authority from the various sections of the Municipal Code and the Village Code; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Greenup, Cumberland County, Illinois, currently regulates its Liquor Licenses and Control by and through Chapter 5.04 of the Village Code; and

WHEREAS, the Village Board has determined it is in the best interest of the Village to revise Chapter 5.04 of the Village Code with respect to employment of minors.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE VILLAGE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF GREENUP, CUMBERLAND COUNTY, ILLINOIS, THAT:

SECTION ONE: The recitals set forth hereinabove are hereby incorporated as findings as if said recitals were fully set forth within this Section One.

SECTION TWO: That Title 5, Chapter 5.04, Section 040 of the Village Code, Liquor License and Control, is hereby amended, with additions in bold, underline text, and deletions with strikethrough, as evidenced by the language in Exhibit A.

SECTION THREE: All Ordinances and Resolutions, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith, are hereby repealed.

SECTION FOUR: If any part or parts of this Ordinance shall be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity of the remaining parts of this Ordinance. The Village Board declares hereby that they would have passed the remaining parts of this Ordinance if they had known that such part or parts thereof would be declared unconstitutional.

SECTION FIVE: The Village Clerk of the Village of Greenup is directed hereby to publish this Ordinance in pamphlet form.

SECTION SIX: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval in accordance with the manner prescribed by law.

EXHIBIT A

5.04.040 Miscellaneous Provisions

...

4. Class "D" – (Restaurant/Lounge)

Shall authorize the retail sale by restaurants of alcoholic liquor for consumption on the premises. The premises only be permitted as follows:

- a.) In a restaurant dining area provided that the sale is incidental and complementary to the sale and service of a complete meal served and eaten at a table within the restaurant; or**
- b.) In a bar service area adjacent to the dining area located with a restaurant, with or without the sale of a meal.**

The annual fee for such a license shall be Six Hundred Dollars (\$600.00). There shall be no more than one (1) license issued during any year.
